21st October 2021

This week we have been learning about autumn and seasonal changes. The children enjoyed listening to the story 'I love fall – touch and feel' and looking for signs of autumn. The children investigated fruits and vegetables of the season, looked at different leaves (colour, size and shape), acorns, conkers and the weather change.

We also learned an autumn song!

In Mini-Woodies, the children explored the woodland area looking for signs of autumn. Then they enjoyed painting with autumn colours and drawing autumn pictures. They loved pumpkin painting and pumpkin play!

Red Acorns

During chatterbox time, the children learned about autumn. We introduced vocabulary such as pumpkin, pomegranate, seeds, conkers, acorns and leaves. The children enjoyed exploring the items in the box.

Blue Acorns

During phonics we continued focusing on listening skills. The children had to listen carefully for instructions, sounds or music to be able to find a hidden toy. The children are getting really confident with their listening skills and enjoyed playing the phonics games.

In maths, the children have been learning about matching objects that are the same. We match objects by size, colour or shape and the children were able to explain what was the same when matching the objects.
