

EYFS Newsletter

21st April 2022

We had a great start to the Summer Term after a restful break. The children were excited to share their holidays with their teachers and friends and all settled back into routines quickly.

We began our 'Growing and Life Cycle' topic by learning about the environment. The children helped their teachers to sweep leaves in our outdoor area, tidy resources and make sure that our classrooms are tidy at the end of play.

During continuous provision, the children investigated flowers, drew observational drawings of flowers and plants, made flowers out of playdough and junk modelling and watered our plants.

Nursery

In English, we listened to the story Lola plants a garden. We discussed what a garden is and what can be grown in our garden. The children drew their pictures of their own garden with beautiful flowers and mini beasts.

In Phonics, we began our oral blending and segmenting unit. The children have been enjoying playing I spy outside. The teacher sound talk the words for children to oral blend such as c-ar, z-i-p, ch-air, d-o-g and c-a-t.

In Mathematics, we continued with developing number patterns skills and using familiar shapes to create animals.

Reception

In English, we listened to the story Tidy and discussed taking care of the environment. The children wrote an apology letter to the forest and the animals and created posters of how to protect them.


In Phonics, we began phase 4. This week we focus on short vowels and writing CVCC words. We practised how to read and write words such as tent, went, jump, soft, lost and pond. We also introduced the tricky words said, so, have and like.

In Mathematics, the children learned about numbers beyond 10. Through practical activities the children made different representations of numbers to 20.

In P.E., we began our tennis unit. The children experimented with throwing and catching a tennis ball.

- How many number bonds for the number 20 can you say?
