This week, we continued to learn about the environment and the children enjoyed spending even more time outdoors.

Continuous provision was very much linked to our new topic. The children carefully planted some seeds, watered the plants and swept leaves. They made amazing artworks, printing with flowers, leaves and twigs and created gardens from playdough.

The Nursery children explored mark making and copied writing patterns using different resources such as chalk, sticks, pencils and of course, their fingers.

In Reception the children loved reading outside in our refreshed story circle and exploring our new music area!

Acorns Nursery

In English, we listened to the story 'Oliver's Vegetables' and the children answered simple questions about the story. They also drew some of their favourite vegetables.

In Phonics, we continue to play games to encourage oral blending and segmenting. The children enjoyed playing toy talk. Mr Bunny is our phonics puppet. This week he helped us learn new phonic sounds and words, such as ch-ee-se and g-r-ee-n.

In Mathematics, we have been introducing length vocabulary such as longest and shortest. The children used this key vocabulary to describe the length of different objects.

In Mini-Woodies, the children picked up natural resources to create natural bunting.


Reception

In English, we listened to the story 'Eddie's Garden and how to grow things'. The children wrote sentences to explain what flowers need to grow. They then pretended to be Eddie and wrote a shopping list before going to our garden centre.

In Phonics, we continued to learn how to read and write Phase 4 words such as shelf, milk, shrink, frog and truck. The children learned the tricky words some, come, love and do.

In Mathematics, the children continued to learn about numbers beyond 10. They listened to the story 'One is a snail ten is a crab' and created their representations of numbers.

We were treated to Kuk Sool's demonstrations which involved children from Acorns Nursery and CPS! They both smiled, were confident and showed their resilience and enthusiasm! I think I was almost as proud as their own families.

I am sure you have seen our safeguarding procedures / dismissal changes first hand, releasing one child at a time with one adult leading this. Thank you for your patience! You will also have seen that we have created a safe holding area with the temporary fencing which the children know they should not pass. This also serves to increase visibility and ensure a child could not wander off. As you know we had staff absent that day so I was working in Nursery rather than on the green gate. We will now ensure the gate is also manned. I informed Ofsted and followed LA procedures, as this was a serious incident, letting them know what had happened and our planned changes post our review. I also invited Surrey's Early Years Manager and the Senior Early Years Advisor to visit, look at the site and to offer suggestions. I have attached their report for you to read.

Equally, following a thorough investigation with the local authority designated officer, (although again, we all recognise the seriousness of the incident), the case has been closed ie there are no further actions required.
