This week we learned about the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. The children watched a video about the Queen and we discussed what Jubilee means.

Our butterflies hatched and the children were soooo excited when we released them.

Nursery

In English, the children listened to the story 'The Queen's Handbag' and developed their comprehension skills by answering questions about the story.

In Phonics, we continued to play games to encourage oral blending and segmenting. This week the children played 'Which one?'. The teacher showed a variety of toys to the children and then sound talked for children to blend the phonemes and to find out which object it was, e.g. b-u-s makes bus.

In Mathematics, we learnt about 2D shapes. The children used shapes to build models and then they identified the shapes used speaking in full sentences, e.g "I made a house with a triangle and a square".

In continuous provision, the children enjoyed painting their own union jack flags, making paper crowns and creating playdough crowns for the Queen.

In Mini-Woodies, the children explored bark rubbings. The children chose a tree and used crayons and paper to create their patterns.

Reception


In English, we wrote letters to the Queen congratulating her on her Platinum Jubilee. The children also drew pictures of the Queen and her corgis.

In Phonics, the children completed their Summer 1 assessment on reading phase 3 words and tricky words. We continue to encourage the children to read and write independently during child-initiated activities.

In Mathematics, the children have been assembling puzzles and playing with shapes to develop their spatial reasoning. They enjoyed creating a union jack flag out of shapes.

In continuous provision, the children enjoyed role-playing a royal tea party, writing invitations for the royal party, exploring making tea in the water tray, playing with London landmarks and creating narratives.
