This week we focused our learning on seahorses. The children enjoyed learning a few facts about seahorses such as what they eat, how they move and how baby seahorses are born.

The children proudly showed their seaside projects to their teachers and friends and were very confident when talking about their projects.

Nursery

In English, the children listening to the story 'Secret Seahorse'. The children answered questions about the story speaking in full sentences and enjoyed drawing pictures of seahorses hiding in the sea.

In Phonics, the children enjoyed playing 'What's that noise?' game and using their listening skills to blend CVC words.

In Mathematics, the children have been using number cards and playing games to support them in recognising numbers to 10. The children have enjoyed finding numbers in the environment.

Reception

In English, the children listened to the story 'Mr Seahorse' and wrote fact sheets about seahorses using their phonics knowledge.


In Phonics, the children learned words ending in **ed and ing** such as swimming, morning, jumped, melted and floated. The children reviewed the tricky words **some, come, love, do, the, I, no, go, so, said, you, have and like**.

In Mathematics, the children have been learning about positional language. The children listened to the story 'What the Ladybird heard' and drew maps of the classroom to describe the position of objects and resources. They also investigated the position of objects from different perspectives.

In Mini-Woodies this week the children have been making their own jewellery using the natural resources in the mini-woodies area. The children made necklaces, bracelets and crowns. This activity helps the children to develop their fine motor skills.


