

EYFS Newsletter

20th October 2022

This week we finished our 'Fairy Tales' topic listening to the story 'Cinderella'. We focused our learning on the ending of a story.

We also celebrated Autumn Day and the children learned about seasonal changes and immersed in learning about the autumn season.

Red Acorns

In Communication and Language, the children listened to the story, were encouraged to join in with actions, and repeated phrases.

In Physical Development, the children enjoyed exploring different tools to create marks and patterns.

In Personal, Social and Emotional, the children continued to explore the resources in the different areas of learning and were encouraged to join in activities with their friends and teachers.

Blue Acorns

In English, we listened to the weekly story and answered simple questions about it. The children also drew pictures of Cinderella.

In Mathematics, the children learned about patterns. They made their own patterns out of Duplo and looked for repeated patterns.

In Phonics, we introduced the phoneme 'n'. The children played oral blending games and blended words beginning with the phoneme nnnn, such as net, nest and necklace.

During child-initiated activities in the Nursery, the children enjoyed printing leaves, painting autumn trees, riding bikes and building models out of junk.

Reception

In English, we listened to the weekly story and we discussed the ending of a story. The children thought carefully about what could come next in the story and created their own endings.

In Mathematics, we learned about **repeating patterns**. The children explored repeating patterns in songs, actions and with objects.


In Phonics, we reviewed all phase 2 phonemes and tricky words taught. The children also completed their autumn 1 assessment. During half term, please encourage your child to practise their phonemes, oral blending and reading. This will support them when learning new phonemes after the holiday.

During child-initiated activities, the children enjoyed making pumpkin paintings, exploring spices in the mud kitchen, using the numicon for counting and practising writing independently.

In Mini-Woodies, the children have been on a scavenger hunt, finding different natural objects around the area. This week's key vocabulary is: **pinecone, pine needles, acorn, stump.**

Packed Lunches – Please be aware that we are a nuts and sesame free school due to allergies. Please do not send any products containing sesame or nuts in your child's packed lunch.
