

EYFS Newsletter

3rd November 2022

This term we are learning about the 'People Who Help Us'. This week we focused our learning on firefighters and how they help in the community.

Red Acorns

In Communication and Language, the children listened to the story 'Tom and Tim meet the Firefighters' and learned key vocabulary such as fire engine, firefighter and helmet.

In Physical Development, the children have been developing their gross motor skills by moving in different ways and practising their balancing skills.

In Personal, Social and Emotional, the children have been developing social skills in play and learning how to share resources with their friends.

Blue Acorns

In English, we listened to the weekly story and answered simple questions about it. We discussed what we can see at the fire station and why we need to call 999.

In Mathematics, the children learned about counting.

In Phonics, we revisited the phoneme 's'. The children played oral blending games and blended words beginning with the phoneme **sss** such as sun, sit and sat.

During child-initiated activities in the Nursery, the children enjoyed making firefighters' hats, fire paintings, exploring playdough, making marks with chalk and pretending to be firefighters putting out fire.

Reception

In English, we listened to the story 'No Dragons for Tea' and we discussed how firefighters help us in the community. The children pretended to call 999 and saying their full address.

In Mathematics, we learned about the numbers 1, 2 and 3. The children listened to the story 'One Bear at Bedtime' and went on a number hunt to find representations of the numbers 1, 2 and 3.


In Phonics, we continue to learn phase 2 phonemes. This week we learn the digraphs ff, ll, ss and the phoneme j. The children oral blended words such as mess, off, bell and jam. They also wrote captions using their phonics knowledge.

During child-initiated activities, the children enjoyed creating pictures of fireworks, exploring a fire safety role-play and playing in our Co-Op shop.

In Mini-Woodies, the children have been creating patterns inspired by bonfire night using natural resources. This week's key vocabulary is: pattern and celebration.


